





13th DISTRICT DEPUTY GRAND MASTER REPORT 2023-2024

1) <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

"Strength is not physical, but spiritual and with it you can destroy many things". "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go".

Since the end of the UK government-enforced lockdown in March 2022, the lodges in the 13th District have encountered a myriad of problems with the US Military on the bases where they are located. The principal problem has been getting re-registered as private organizations on the military establishments without which the lodges had to confront some vexatious, aggravating and frustrating issues.

2) <u>HISTORICAL ASPECT</u>

From the inception in 1968, the lodges in the 13th District have been reliant on the US military establishments on which they are located for rent-free accommodation, opportunities for fund-raising, avenues to publicize the fraternal institution and the like. As such, the lodges' income including the annual subscriptions has always been linked to receiving the aforementioned 'support' from the military establishments.

However, the above is on the premise that the lodges are officially registered private organizations on the military facilities, which they have been unable to accomplish since the end of the Covid-19 lockdown. Despite these setbacks, the lodge members, whether resident in the UK or elsewhere, have worked assiduously to ensure the survival of their individual lodges. I can report that the lodges were able to meet all of their financial obligations to this Grand Lodge and the two-year impasse the lodges have been experiencing with the US military establishments is about to end.

3) <u>SCHOLARSHIPS</u>

The 13th District lodges, despite their trials and tribulations, have cooperated with the local United Supreme Council, Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite, Prince Hall Affiliation, Southern Jurisdiction Consistories in England to award three scholarships totalling nearly £5,500 to three exceptional young people presently attending reputable higher education institutions.

Emilian Bowry, is a 20 year old student in the second of a four year Masters degree course in Engineering at the incomparable Trinity College of Cambridge University. He is credited with creating a 'novel electrochemical and material mechanism for detecting the spiking agents in beverages' and 'an open source resource for quantitative analysis'. Beyond the Masters degrees, Emilian has his eyes set on completing a doctorate degree at the above-mentioned education institution before embarking on an academic teaching career.

Young Yaw Antwi-Boasiako is now in the final year of a Bachelor of Science degree in Finance and Management at the University of Loughborough. He recently completed a placement year with Forvis Mazars where he gained 'experience in Corporate Restructuring, Wealth/Investment Management and Insolvency'. He intends pursuing a career in Corporate Restructuring.

Taryn McPherson is an 18 year old now attending the University of Guyana in pursuit of a Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS) degree which is a five-year long program, on the journey to becoming a pediatrician. She candidly states: 'I am eager to immerse myself in the extensive training and education that the MBBS degree offers which will equip me with the expertise required to excel in the medical field and make a tangible difference in the lives of young patients.'

4) <u>MEETINGS</u>

Being unable to meet on their located US military facilities, the members of the lodges journeyed to the Chapel Annex at RAF Alconbury once a month to attend their individual lodge meetings. All lodge meetings held at one location on the same day engendered occasions for Masonic education. Members were given the opportunity to participate in all of the meetings and thus listen to the many Masonic lectures provided.

5) <u>COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT</u>

The inability to actively participate in the US military establishment activities as Masonic bodies did not stop the membership from contributing to their local communities. Some members work assiduously with their churches, the local schools, care homes and food banks to provide for the needy, ever mindful of the saying, 'Where there is a will, there is a way'. I do salute the members for their assiduity.

6) <u>CONCLUSION</u>

Despite the obstacles in the path of the members of the 13th District, especially during the last 12 months, they found a way to meet as lodges, contribute to the needy collectively and individually, assist aspiring young people to achieve their educational and vocational goals with scholarship awards, and most importantly, improve in Masonry.

Over the last 12 months, the members of the 13th District have been adhering to the various restrictions placed on non-registered private organizations on US military facilities, but have still managed to survive. The resilience of the members must be commended.

Mizpah (מְצָפה, miṣpāh, mitspah) is Hebrew for "watchtower". As mentioned in the biblical story of Jacob and Laban, (Genesis 31:44–54) making a pile of stones marked an agreement between two people, with God as their watching witness.[1]

Biblical narrative

Jacob had secretly fled the house of Laban, his father-in-law, in the middle of the night, taking flocks of animals, all his other assets, and his two wives and their children (the daughters and grandchildren of Laban) with him, intending never to return. Laban discovered this and pursued Jacob. After discussion, the two decided to formalize the separation.

Laban admitted that his daughters had voluntarily left, saying, "Yet what can I do today about these daughters of mine, or about the children they have borne?" (Genesis 31:43 (NIVUK)). He agreed to let Jacob go in peace, but exacted a promise from Jacob to never abuse his daughters or take additional wives (Genesis 31:50).

The two men then determined to erect a pile of stones, a figurative watchtower, called a mizpah, to commemorate this promise, even though no person was present other than the two men when it was made, for "God is witness between you and me". Both of the men also agreed that they would consider the mizpah a border between their respective territories, and that they would not pass the watchtower to visit one another "to do evil".[2]

Usage

Since that time, the mizpah has come to connote an emotional bond between people who are separated (either physically or by death). Mizpah jewelry is often made in the form of a coin-shaped pendant cut in two with a zig-zag line bearing the words "The LORD watch between me and thee, when we are absent one from another".[3] This is worn to signify the bond. Additionally, the word "mizpah" is often used as the name for a cemetery[4][5] and can often be found on headstones in cemeteries and on other memorials:

And [it was called] Mizpah (Watchtower); for he said, The Lord watch between me and thee, when we are absent one from another.[6]

Subject: Year End report from the Board of Trustees

Most Worshipful Grand Master Osborne Sr.,

What a difference 16 months makes! The Board of Trustees has been moving at top-notch speed and it has been showing consistently. While we did not check off all our 2024 items, we have made a dent, and we will continue to push until we reach our goal. The BOT has reached a point where we can shift to "preventive mode". We are only focusing on making sure that we keep the building running at a high efficiency without costing us a lot of money but making sure we are using licensed, reputable companies to work in our space. One of the biggest completions the BOT had in 2024 was after almost 13 years, almost 250 bricks from our brick program were laid in front of our Grand Lodge to include the ones that were sitting in the BOT office for 5 years. While we did not finish all of the bricks, we do have a serious plan in place that will ensure that it will not be another 13 years before a brick is laid. Another item we were able to focus on was replacing the fire alarm system inside of the Grand Lodge and Sanctuary. I was pleased when we were able to use the Grant money that we had to pay for the system saving the Grand Lodge almost **\$190,000**. As of this date we are still working with the company so that the plans can be approved by Baltimore City so that they can start the work. The fire alarm project will be completed in 2025. One of my personal goals for next masonic year is to assess our real estate assets and determine where we are with them. Our other buildings need to match the look and feel of our Grand Lodge.

More of the items completed on that list were:

- Converting to LED lighting inside of the Samuel T. Daniels Sanctuary
- Security cameras in various places inside of the GL
- Repair and repainting of stations inside of the blue lodge rooms and Red Room on 3rd floor.
- Hosting an event to raise funds (Pre-Father's Day Comedy Show)

Some of our upcoming plans for 2025 are:

- Adding a key fob system to the front door of the GL for security of our members
- Convert the GL's HVAC system to heat pumps to cut cost on Gas & Electric bill
- Continuing Phase 1 of the repair of our Sanctuary.
- Complete Phase 2 digital infrastructure (wireless access points throughout GL)
- Visiting all properties that are owned by the Grand Lodge and assess them for repairs
- Build relationships so that we can apply and receive Grant Funds to help our organization

I would like to thank RW Kip Hall who came on board late and has been getting his hands dirty every single day, WM David Linder, RW Brent Jones, PM Courtney Gardner, WM Marionese Forderingham, WM Cassandra Townsend and the youngest member who is unofficially on our team but has been hands on and helping with whatever we need JW Montez Rollins who have consistently supported me and have been all in since the beginning.

Most importantly, I am relieved to share that our Masonic year ended without any security-related casualties during our events and activities.

This year, the **OSS** team has been deeply committed to providing safety and security services that protect our valued members and property, ensuring peace of mind for over 2,000 individuals during all Grand Lodge functions. Our emphasis on **safety-first principles** has been made possible thanks to the steadfast support of our Most Worshipful Grand Master, the Honorable **Noel C. Osborne Sr.** His compassionate leadership has truly nurtured a culture of security awareness throughout the Grand Lodge, making us all feel more secure and cared for.

Key Accomplishments for 2024:

- Grand Lodge Events Coverage:
 - Provided security oversight for all major Grand Lodge events, including:
 - Grand Lodge Annual Session
 - Grand Lodge Joint Christmas Party
 - Bowie State Basketball Game
 - $\circ \quad 1^{st} \mathchar`- 2^{nd} \mathchar`- and 3^{rd} \ Occasional \ Lodge \ Meetings$
 - Grand Lodge Crab Feast
 - Prince Hall Day Ceremony

• Concealed Carry Policy Implementation:

This year, the **OSS successfully continued the Concealed Carry Policy, which is** aligned with Maryland's firearm regulations. With the **approval of the Grand Master**, **96 members** have been granted permission to carry concealed weapons for the protection of our community. We encourage all brothers and sisters with concealed carry licenses to **register their permits with the Grand Lodge** to maintain a secure environment for all members.

• External Collaboration:

We established critical partnerships, such as collaborating with local law enforcement and EMS services. This included:

- Joint efforts with **Baltimore EMS** to ensure readiness for emergencies.
- Attendance and participation in Maryland's **National Night Out** to strengthen relationships with law enforcement agencies.
- Submission of the **OSS Security White Paper** to Grand Lodge leadership, setting new guidelines and frameworks for security procedures.

Priorities for the New Masonic Year:

1. Develop an Action Plan for Background Investigations

• Collaborate with the OSS team to enhance pre-clearance processes for all PH Masonic members.

2. Update Records for Concealed Carry Applications

- Ensure that new applications and approvals align with evolving legal standards and lodge requirements.
- Streamlining the application process for application requests and approvals.

Key Open Items:

• Office of Safety and Security Constitutional Entry

• Worked with leadership to formalize the **inclusion of the OSS in the Grand Lodge Constitution** to solidify our mandate and operational scope.

of the stewardship of the Office of the Grand Chaplain.

Vision

We aim to assist the Brothers and their family members of MPHGL of Maryland and its jurisdictions to cultivate and effectively live a deepened relationship with the Great Architect of the Universe.

Mission

The Chaplain is to perform those solemn services which we should constantly render to our Infinite Creator, to point to Heaven and lead the way" by assisting Brothers and their families to refine their souls, strengthen their virtues and purify their minds. The Chaplain will represent spirituality, be the moral conscience, and provide ministry to and for the Brothers in the Lodge, in Maryland and its Jurisdictions. The Chaplain will care for and encourage the Brothers and their families through guidance, continued prayer, and support through a caring heart, an attentive ear, a commitment to confidentiality, and a truthful tongue. The Chaplain is a constant reminder to all Masons of our dedication to the Architect of the Universe, for without Him, who has been called by many names, we are nothing!

The Work of the Chaplain

As a candidate enters his journey in Masonry, the person who generally proclaims the first words of Holy Scripture is none other than the Chaplain. It is the Chaplain whose duty to the Masonic Brother extends far beyond the Lodge as he becomes the bridge between the mundane and the Divine. The Chaplain is equipped and burdened to answer the question, "Is there a Word from the Lord"? As belief in God is essential to becoming a Master Mason, the Chaplain becomes essential in unpacking the mysteries of the Great Architect of the Universe. As a Brother deals with the challenges and superfluities of his journey in life in general and his Masonic path in particular, the Chaplain becomes a sort of Guide to help his Brother and honor his Creator.

The presence of the Chaplain is ministry in and of itself. The Chaplain's presence is a constant reminder to reverence, honor, and be mindful of the Great Architect of the Universe. Consequently, the presence of the Chaplain simultaneously shows that, The Giver of all Good and Perfect Gifts is mindful to fulfill the need of the Brethren and their families. The Chaplain is one way that the Creator shows His great concern. In the scriptures, Almighty God who is our Shepherd instructs His people, "I will give you Pastors after my own heart…"

In masonry, the Chaplain has existed since the earliest days of Freemasonry, operative Masons building the cathedrals and castles turned to ordained clergy in their devotions to God. Historically within Prince Hall Masonry there has always

been a closeness of Prince Hall to Christianity. There was a time where Black

people were only allowed to assemble in large numbers in the Black Church. "From the Black Church flowed everything...Consequently 99% of all Black Masons came from the church." The Black church on certain nights became the Black Lodge building and in many cases the Pastor at some point was either the Worshipful Master or the Chaplain. It is not by chance but by design that the Chaplain sits at the Worshipful Master's left in order to speak wise counsel in his ear in the course of a communication.

The Chaplain's duty is to "perform those solemn services which we should constantly render to our Infinite Creator and which, when offered by one whose profession is to point to heaven and lead the way, by refining our souls, strengthening our virtues, and purifying our minds prepare us for admission into the society of those above, with whom our happiness will be endless and perfect". This means that a Chaplain in many ways brings God and His Word to the Brethren and in some cases their families. The Chaplain leads the way in helping Brothers and their families not only forge a relationship with the Creator but to also nurture, deepen and strengthen that relationship. The Chaplain is tasked with not only ministering and serving at Lodge meetings, and official events but also to personally minister to Brothers and their families outside of the Lodge. The Chaplain bears the burden of providing himself as a moral compass and barometer for the Brethren. He is responsible for the spiritual, emotional, and pastoral care of the Lodge and its family members, particularly during times of challenge, affliction, and despair.

My office continues to encourage this jurisdiction with a weekly prayer call to keep us grounded in our hope which is in the Great Architect of the Universe. We continue to minister to this jurisdiction through funerals and counseling as well as jurisdictional services, celebrations, and fraternal meetings and gatherings. It is a blessing to have forged relations and collaborations that benefit the totality of the craft which include: A relationship with the African American Diabetes Association (this includes a MOU). This office continues to share in collaborative efforts and planning in order to facilitate a stronger relationship with the community. The Office of the Grand Chaplain has supported the Grandmaster in representation of the jurisdiction locally and across the country and also internationally. We look forward to furthering all of these efforts in the coming year as well as the full utilization of the sanctuary in an effort to minister to the needs of this jurisdiction and also of the community.

During the 2023-2024 Masonic Year we continued to build on the momentum and achievements from the previous year. The staff in the Office of the Grand Historian worked well together, realized many of our goals and objectives, and delved into historical research to enlighten the craft. However, to better gage the accomplishments of this Office, and to place them in the proper perspective, we must first review the Goals and Outcomes.

<u>GOALS</u>

In fulfilling the duties of this the Office will:

- 1. Review records, books, medals and other artifacts collected and/or received by the Archives Committee or discovered by independent research. We will then draft a narrative of the history and importance of said item(s) for maintenance in the Grand Lodge's archives.
- 2. Conduct research on past Grand Lodge officers, events, documents, and artifacts, while providing a written narrative of those findings.
- 3. Work with constituent lodges to chronicle their history, and note significant accomplishments of individual lodges and Brothers, that contribute to the improvement of Prince Hall Freemasonry, and the community.
- 4. Promote the accurate communication of the history of this Jurisdiction and Prince Hall Freemasonry.

OUTCOMES

The following are activities will be necessary as we conduct the work of the Office:

- 1. Provide for review and inspection at the Grand Lodge artifacts and documents that tells the story of Prince Hall Freemasonry and its members.
- 2. Provide workshops for lodges and members on how to chronicle their history.
- 3. Present at quarterly Occasional Lodge meetings and Grand Lodge Sessions our findings.
- 4. Present historical lectures and invite experts in the field of Masonic history to present.
- 5. Identify the Grand Lodge's role with local and state landmarks, buildings, institutions and events that have had an impact on the community.
- 6. Identify and highlight famous local, state and national Maryland Prince Hall Freemasons.
- 7. Visit Jurisdictional lodges and establish working relationships with other PHA lodges to learn from their experiences and gather history.
- 8. Securely display and share artifacts, documents and narrations of our findings.

Now that we have established the basis for our work, let us report on the activities of the Office for the 2023-2024 Masonic Year:

Research/Publications (Goal #4)

During this reporting period the Grand Historian submitted a research article for publication in the Jurisdiction's magazine, *The Light*. The article covered the lives of William Ashbie Hawkins and George W. F. McMechen, who were among the first Black lawyers in the state of Maryland, and their efforts to fight against housing segregation in the early 1900's. Both of whom were members of Enterprise Lodge No. 3, and served as legal counsel for the Most Worshipful United Grand Lodge.

The Office of the Grand Historian has conducted an in-depth search, as best we could, of the recorded Most Worshipful Past Grand Masters of the Jurisdiction. Our concentration has been on the MWPGMs of the Most Worshipful First Colored Grand Lodge of Maryland. Through our research, we have discovered that our current record of MWPGMs does not include six (6) MWPGMs we have found. We have also found who we believe is the first MWGM of the MW First Colored Grand Lodge of Maryland, who is James Johnson who served 1848-1850. The other MWPGMs are as follows:

It is our recommendation that these names be added to the Grand Lodge's website and included in the history of the Grand Lodge.

Lodge History Project (Goal #3)

On January 21, 2022, a memorandum was sent to Regional and District Deputy Grand Masters asking for their assistance to collect the history of their constituent lodges. The primary purpose of this is not only to have the histories on file, but to review and have them prepared to be included into the bicentennial record/book for 2025. We are happy to report that all state side lodges have submitted their lodge's history.

Education/Presentations (Outcome #4)

- The Office presented the history of the MWPHGL of MD at the first meeting of Lodge of Instruction for the Northern and Western regions on January 6, 2024. On January 13, R.W.s Sean Wright of Fairmount Lodge No. 92 and Shannon Vance-Corbett of Dunkirk Lodge No. 77, presented to the LOI for the Southern Region and R.W. Carlos Fields of St. James Lodge No. 2, presented to the LOI for the Eastern Shore.
- On May 23, 2024, the Grand Historian presented a historical lecture to the members of William F. Taylor Lodge No. 57, entitled "Why We March." The lecture gave the masonic influence on the march across the Edmund Pettus Bridge in Selma, Alabama, which lead to the bloody Sunday march.
- On October 8, 2024, the Grand Historian participated the Baltimore City Office of Equity and Civil Rights, Annual Civil Rights Week. This event was coordinated with R.W. Roland Selby of King David Lodge No. 18. The Grand Historian presented at Morgan State University on the topic From Protest to Progress: A Historical Perspective of the Morgan-Masonic Struggle for Education, Liberation and Self-Determination.
- During this masonic year, each month the Office submitted historical dates regarding Prince Hall masonry that have been posted on the Grand Lodges social media sites.

Research/Service (Goals #2, #4/Outcomes # 3, #7)

- The Grand Historian was asked to review and make a recommendation on the recognition of the Grand Lodge of Lebanon after its recognition had been revoked by the MWPHGLDC. Additionally, the Grand Historian was asked to review and make a recommendation on the request from the M.W. Grand Lodge F.& A.M. of Utah's request for fraternal recognition.
- On April 3, 2024, R.W. Sean Wright (92), and Bro. Tavaris Burke (145) along with the Grand Historian visited Odenton Lodge No. 209 of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Maryland A.F. & A.M. to support R.W. Stanley Conyer's (134) Prince Hall presentation.
- The Office assisted the Office of the Junior Grand Warden in planning the Black History Month program. The Grand Historian served as the Master of Ceremony.
- The Grand Historian visited St. Johns Lodge No. 5, and William F. Taylor Lodge No. 57, on Feb. 22, 2024.
- The Grand Historian served as the co-chair for the Prince Hall Americanism Day Observance on September 16, 2024, and delivered the occasion.
- On September 16, 2024, the Grand Historian sat for an interview by the Baltimore Legacy Project, and Dr. Rasheem to discuss the role that Maryland Prince Hall masons played in Baltimore during the Civil Rights Movement, and its current activities in community. - On September 19, 2024, the Grand Historian participated in a meeting with the Grand Lecturer, the Grand Parliamentarian, the RDGM for the Northern Region, and the WM of Federal Lodge No. 9, to discuss the operation of Federal No. 9 and its efforts to establish a masonic education committee at Morgan State University. It was decided that all activities at the University would be stayed until a review of the proposal and plans was conducted by the Offices of the Grand Lecturer and Grand Historian.
- The Grand Historian attended the 1st Occasional Grand Lodge meeting on March 9, 2024, and the third Occasional Grand Lodge meeting on September 28, 2024.
- The Office was contacted by an author who is conducting research on Louis C. Tiffany, famed artisan and creator of the Tiffany lamps and glass. The author requested to come to the Grand Lodge to look at ornaments and windows that were constructed by Tiffany.

Bicentennial Planning Committee

The D.G.M. has asked that the Office of the Grand Historian head-up the committee to plan the Bicentennial activities for the Grand Lodge. The Planning Committee has been active working on the celebration of the Jurisdiction's 200th anniversary, and that of Friendship Lodge No. 1. To date, the calendar for 2025 is complete and ready to go to the printer for production. The commemorative coin has been created. We are currently looking to re-brand the annual Grand Lodge's events for next year under the umbrella of the Bicentennial, to include the Black History Month program, Prince Hall Day and the Annual Crab Feast, and the Master Mason's Ball. We will start the year with a church service at the Sharpe Street Methodist Church on February 2, 2025. We have also spoken with the Laurel Cemetery Project to plan for a memorial service on Juneteenth of 2025, to honor Past Grand Lodge officers and members buried at the site. The MWPHGL of PA has been contacted to re-present the warrant for African Friendship Lodge No. 6, (now Friendship Lodge No. 1). We are planning to design a banner, commemorative aprons, a trowel, and banners to place on light poles in Baltimore City for the celebration. R.W. Mike Hanie has also been instrumental in the planning.

Historical Events

Lecture: Why Kemet Matters- The African Origin of Civilization and Masonry (Outcome #4)

We would like to appoint regional assistant officers to service the entire state and engage lodges.
